



KINGS COUNTY APPLICATION FOR ELECTION OFFICERS

The Kings County Elections Office maintains a list of people who have expressed an interest in working as an Election Officer. Election Officers are needed at various times throughout the year, depending on the election schedule. Inspector and Clerk workdays begin at **6:00 a.m.** and end around **10:00 p.m.**, while Election Night Volunteers work between **7:30 p.m. and midnight**. All Inspectors and first time Clerks are required to attend a training class that lasts about two hours. Daily stipends are paid as follows: Precinct Inspectors - \$140, Roving Inspectors - \$115, Clerks - \$110 per day, and Election Night Volunteers - \$50. The Elections Department is looking for people who are helpful, conscientious, and friendly. Additionally, there is a great need for Election Officers who can provide bilingual assistance to Spanish and Tagalog speaking voters. You are required to be at least eighteen years of age, a registered California voter OR a legal resident of the United States who would be eligible to vote except for their citizenship status. Persons who are on parole for the conviction of a felony may not serve as an Election Official. By law all precinct workers are required to be able to read and write in English.
