**CALL TO ORDER:** A regular meeting of the Kings County Water Commission (KCWC) was called to order by Chairman Gilkey at 5:00 p.m., on November 25, 2013. The KCWC meeting was held in the Multi-Purpose Room of the Administration Building (Bldg. No. 1), 1400 W. Lacey Blvd., Hanford, California.

Roll call of members was conducted by Secretary Gatzka, and a quorum of appointed Committee members were in attendance.

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES:** A motion was made and seconded (Pedersen/Mills) to approve the minutes of the November 25, 2013 meeting. Motion carried unanimously with Gordon and Casida absent.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

**A. Kings River Integrated Regional Water Management Plan – Eric Osterling** – Mr. Osterling provided a draft of the revised and updated Kings River Integrated Regional Water Management Plan. The State of California Department of Water Resources requires that organizations and

agencies individually adopt the Kings Basin IRWMP to be eligible for Proposition 84 and Proposition 1E Integrated Regional Water Management grant funds. Kings County, as an Interested Party of the Kings Basin Water Authority, is being asked to adopt the Kings River Integrated Regional Water Management Plan.

A motion was made and seconded (Mills/Verboon) to recommend that the BOS support and adopt the revised Kings Basin IRWMP and to support its continuing development and implementation. Motion carried unanimously with Gordan and Casida absent.

**B. State Water Boards Groundwater Workplan**

Mr. Erik Kaeding provided an update to the Commission on the Draft Groundwater Workplan Concept paper and a draft letter to the State Water Resources Control Board. He reported that he had attended the Water Board meeting in Sacramento and that things look like the first steps are being taken for State takeover of water. He suggested that we need to do a better job on the local level of managing our groundwater and to let the state know we don't want top down regulation. He also prepared a letter for the Commission to consider

Don Mills asked to have "increase surface storage water and recharge and recharge groundwater" added to the last paragraph of the proposed letter. The committee agreed that they would like to determine what the thresholds are at the local level rather than asking the State what the thresholds are.

A motion was made and seconded (Howe/Ehlers) to set up a subcommittee consisting of Craig Pedersen, Jim Verboon, Don Mills and Mark Gilkey giving them the authority to act on behalf of the entire commission to work on the letter to the State Water Resources Control Board with Erik Kaeding. Motion carried unanimously with Gordan and Casida absent.

**MISCELLANEOUS**

**A. Staff Comments** – None

**B. Member Comments** – Mark Gilkey asked about updating a map showing water sources in the county. He stated that he would work on updating the map with numerical data. Mr. Gilkey also reported that the deadline for the comment period for the Bay Delta Conservation Plan had been moved from October to December. The Governors office wants to move forward and this will allow interim financing to carry the project forward until the project starts and bonds can be sold. He also reported that on December 14<sup>th</sup> or 15<sup>th</sup> there would be renegotiation with Department of Water Resources to extend the Water Supply Contract.
