This meeting will be held in the Community Development Agency Conference Room, Engineering Building No. 6, Kings County Government Center, 1400 W. Lacey Boulevard, Hanford, California. Pursuant to California Government Code Section 65009, subdivision (b), if you challenge a decision of the Advisory Agency in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing, or in written correspondence delivered to the Advisory Agency at, or prior to, the public hearing.

I. CALL TO ORDER - Meeting of Division One of the Kings County Advisory Agency

1. NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL:

For projects where the Advisory Agency action is final, actions are subject to appeal by any interested person and no development proposed by the application may be authorized until the final date of the appeal.

An appeal may be filed with the Kings County Community Development Agency, at 1400 W. Lacey Blvd., Building #6, Hanford, CA, on forms available at the Kings County Community Development Agency. A filing fee of \$320 must accompany the appeal form. The appeal must be filed within 10 days of the Advisory Agency's decision date, not including the date of the decision. If no appeal is received, the Advisory Agency's action is final.

2. UNSCHEDULED APPEARANCES

Any person may address the Advisory Agency on any subject matter within the jurisdiction or responsibility of the Advisory Agency at the beginning of the meeting; or may elect to address the Advisory Agency on any agenda item at the time the item is called by the Chair, but before the matter is acted upon by the Advisory Agency. Unscheduled comments will be limited to five minutes.

II. OLD BUSINESS

- 1. NOTICE OF INTENT TO RECORD A VIOLATION (HAKKER)** - On February 7, 2011, two Grant Deeds were recorded as Document No. 1102273 and 1102274 of Kings County Records. It appears the deeds were recorded without a parcel map resulting in the division of Parcel 1 which was established on March 30, 2004 in Book 16 of Parcel Maps at Page 79, Kings County Records (APN's 028-020-045 & 058) that has created an illegal division of approximately a 14 acre parcel and a 5.32 acre parcel. On June 10, 2015, the property owners were mailed a Notice of Intent to Record a Violation. The purpose of the meeting is to provide the property owners an opportunity to explain why the notice should not be recorded.

III. NEW BUSINESS

- 1. IN LIEU PARCEL MAP NO. 15-10 (HAMAR)** – the applicant proposes to adjust the property between four (4) existing parcels (3.46 acres, 1.20 acres, 1.14 acres and 0.88 acres) located at 6549, 6509 and 6517 Kent Avenue, Hanford, Assessor's Parcel No: 028-190-050, 069, 070, and 071. The adjustment will be accomplished by recording a parcel map. As a result of the adjustment the number of parcels will be reduced from 4 to 3 (1.0 acre, 1.0 acre, and 4.30 acres).
